To all ITQ Respondents for Professional Acquisition Support Services (PASS) for Information Technology,

The State of Iowa evaluation committee has reviewed the proposals received in response to ITQ #185-2189-2025 for Professional Acquisition Support Services (PASS) for Information Technology.

The ITQ is structured as a multiple-award prequalification, each with identical terms and conditions. A Respondent who receives a score of 700 or above will be named a successful Respondent (Awardee). A Respondent who receives a score less than 700 will not be considered a successful Respondent. Successful Respondents will be afforded an opportunity to enter into a contract with the Department of Management and will be afforded an opportunity to bid or submit proposals on future scopes of work. Governmental entities requesting services will conduct a competitive solicitation process limited to the pre-qualified vendors. A pre-qualified vendor is a successful Respondent who completes the contracting process.

As stated in the ITQ, the Agency's intent is to award multiple contracts for this procurement. The State of Iowa hereby gives Notice of Intent to Award to the following successful Respondents:

Per Section 3.29 of the ITQ, a Respondent whose Proposal has been timely filed and who is aggrieved by the Notice of Intent to Award of the Agency may appeal the decision by filing a written Notice of Intent to Appeal (in accordance with Iowa Administrative Code rule 129—11.3) to: The Iowa Department of Management, 1007 E. Grand Avenue, G13, Des Moines, IA 50309 and a copy to the Issuing Officer at ITContracts@dom.iowa.gov. The Notice of Intent to Appeal must be filed within five (5) days of the date of the Notice of Intent to Award issued by the Agency, exclusive of Saturdays, Sundays, and legal State holidays.

This Notice of Intent to Award is contingent upon successfully executing a written contract. As a result, this Notice does NOT constitute the formation of a contract between the State and the Awardee. The Awardee shall not acquire any legal or equitable rights relative to the ITQ until a written contract acceptable to the State of Iowa has been executed.

If the Awardee fails to execute a contract with the State for any reason, the State, in its sole discretion, may cancel this Notice of Intent to Award to the awarded Respondent. The State further reserves the right to cancel the Award at any time before executing a written contract.
