




On the Way Home[®] Service Description Summary

- A 12 to 14-month, evidence-based aftercare program.
- Focused on family and school centered services.
- Designed for at-risk youth returning from an out-of-home placement.
- Includes careful assessment and service planning.
- Facilitates teaching and application of parenting, social, and academic support skills.
- Provides advocacy and intervention within both home and school environments.

Family Support

- Improves child-family relationships
- Establishes clear, consistent rules and expectations
- Teaches skills for lifelong success
- Encourages good behavior

- Promotes self-control

School Support


- Establishes school partnerships

- Establishes an at-home learning environment

- Willing to ask for and utilize support


- Optimistic about potential

Job Prerequisites: OTWH Supervisors

- Bachelor's degree in Human Services or related field required; Master's degree or higher based on local, state or federal contract requirements preferred.
- 2 to 3 years of experience working with children and families in community-based programs as well as prior management and supervisory experience preferred.
- A valid driver's license with a good driving record and the ability to provide own transportation to complete travel-related job requirements.
- Flexibility to be on-call (continuously or rotationally) to provide support to OTWH Consultants.

Consultant Responsibilities

Primary

- Clarify family goals
- Develop a youth and family Service Plan
- Provide direct, individualized support 1-2 hours weekly
- Initiate school contact
- Facilitate parent skills training
- Monitor school engagement and academic progress
- Foster home and school communication
- Implement homework strategies

Secondary


- Provide 24/7 crisis support
- Identify needed community-based services



Job Prerequisites: OTWH Consultants

- Bachelor's degree in Human Services or related field, or High School diploma with three years of experience in the Boys Town Model required.
- 1 to 2 years of experience working with children and families in community-based programs preferred.
- A valid driver's license with a good driving record and the ability to provide own transportation to complete travel-related job requirements.
- Flexibility to work non-traditional business hours including early mornings, nights, weekends, holidays, etc. and respond to crises of clients as needed.


































OTWH Service Delivery Plan:

Boys Town to Agency

- FIT and Readiness Assessment
- 5 day On the Way Home® Training
- 2 day On the Way Home® Supervisor Training
- 15 hours phone/web-based consultation
- 12-month On-Site Visit/Re-Licensing Review
- 24 hours data collection/analysis
- Licensing and Relicensing Options

*Note: The above denotes the minimum amounts of training and support that will be provided to any licensed OTWH program. The actual frequency of on-site visits, and hours needed for phone/web-based consultation or data analysis may be increased based upon agency need.

Agency to Clients

- 12-14 months of service (14 recommended), including
- A Minimum of 96 hours total direct contact with each youth/family over the service period.
- Weekly home visits at a suggested length of 1-2 hours per visit and 2 or more hours per week for the purpose of providing family and homework support.
- Weekly indirect contact a minimum of 1 hour per week to support family and youth skill acquisition and engage in problem solving.
- Direct or indirect school contact with youth and his or her identified school mentor a minimum of once weekly to ensure school engagement and academic success.
- 24/7 support for youth and family as needed *Note: The above is based upon 1 OTWH Consultant serving a maximum caseload of 12-15 youth/families.
