

CLARIFICATION OF INTENT

CJIS-URL Integration 2019 Services Contract
MA #20118

I, Tammi Blackstone, CJIS Coordinator, was the primary party involved on behalf of the Criminal Justice Information System (CJIS) during the RFP and contracting process during calendar year 2019 that led to the execution of Contract MA #20118 between CJIS and URL Integration effective 11/1/2019.¹

The integration of our CJIS exchanges requires development both at the CJIS Enterprise Service Bus and at each endpoint of an exchange. Some endpoint agencies have resources in-house to do their own development and some do not. Without endpoint development and maintenance, our exchanges could not exist. It was my intent with this contract that our partner endpoints also be able to contract with MCP for any required development and maintenance needed.

This required work on endpoints is not included in the services that CJIS pays for, but is no less critical to the existence and support of our CJIS exchanges. CJIS intended for our partner agencies to be able to utilize our Master Agreement with MCP to contract with MCP separately for this crucial work.
